6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

As the institution follows the syllabus and curriculum as prescribed by Panjab University, Chandigarh (on NCTE guidelines) so there is little scope of internal curricular designing. When the syllabus got revised for the current session, all the faculty members participated in workshops actively as Subject Experts.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Punjab which includes representatives from the Association of Self-Financed Colleges of Education, affiliated to Panjab University, (Chandigarh), Panjabi University, (Patiala) and Guru Nanak Dev University (Amritsar). Guidelines for admission to self-finance Colleges of Education have been formulated as per NCTE/affiliating University norms by the Federation. At the time of admission, the reservation policy as per rules of Punjab Govt. has also been adopted.
